

We are Arran Open Studios, an organisation run by volunteers under the umbrella of the Arran Theatre and Arts Trust which is a registered charity (Reg No: SC006027) and company limited by guarantee (Reg No: SC119255) with registered office at Carlo, Corrie Shore Brodick, Isle of Arran, KA27 8JA.

Arran Theatre and Arts Trust is an umbrella organisation for Arran Open Studios, Arran Art Trail, Arts Forward, Arran on Film, Music Arran and the McLellan Arts Festival.

Arran Open Studios, alongside Arran Theatre and Arts Trust is committed to ensuring that your privacy is protected. Should we ask you to provide certain information by which you can be identified, then you can be assured that it will only be used in accordance with this privacy policy and in line with the General Data Protection Regulations.

Arran Open Studios and Arran Theatre and Arts Trust may change this policy from time to time by updating this document and uploading it to our website. You should check back from time to time to ensure that you are happy with any changes. This policy is effective from May 2018.

This privacy policy sets out how Arran Open use any personal information we hold about you and your rights on this.

About you

You are an individual:

- using our company's website which is currently at <http://www.arranopenstudios.com>;
- Who has provided feedback in paper form at any of the studios attended;
- who has paid a fee as an artist or collective to exhibit their studio as part of the Arran Open Studio;

The information we may hold about you

What information we may hold about you:

- information you provide us in an online or paper form when you sign up for the Open Studio (for example, your name and contact details, information about your studio);
- communications with us (for example by email or notes of phone calls)
- your usage of our website, for example, what you look at or access, traffic data, location data, weblogs and other communication data, information about your

computer, including – where your browser provides this – your IP address, operating system and browser type

How we will use information about you

We collect and hold information about you:

- to help demonstrate the impact and reach of our work to organisations who fund us
- to manage our organisation and improve what we do
- and, if you agree:
 - to communicate with you about ourselves, our programme and work or opportunities from others that we think you might find interesting;
 - to help us sell more tickets or otherwise earn or raise money to support ourselves so that we are less dependent on funding.

Information about you we use to demonstrate the impact and reach of our work to funders is anonymised. We do not share with them anything which identifies you.

Any feedback you give us we can use in public communications but we won't do so in such a way that people would know it was from you – unless we get your permission.

We may share information about you:

- with analytics providers for the purposes of improving our website;
- with other organisations who help us deliver services to you;

but this will always be under the same conditions as we are under.

We may share information about you with law enforcement agencies or other organisations or individuals if we are obliged to by law or court order. We'll try to inform you of this requirement wherever possible, unless we are legally restricted from doing so.

What you get in return for your information

The value we aim to give you in return for you letting us use information about you is:

- to let you know about when and where our events are on;
- to tailor what we send you by better understanding what you are interested in;
- to give you the chance to buy tickets to our events ahead of the general public;
- to be part of a community that shares values around our interests and the work we programme.

Marketing

We would like to communicate with you about ourselves and our work.

We will only do this if you explicitly give us permission to do this. For example, we won't add you to our mailing list if you just give feedback or contact us through the contact form.

You have the right to opt out at any time from us contacting you for marketing purposes. If you no longer want to be contacted for marketing purposes, please contact us at arrantheatreandarts@gmail.com.

Cookies

Cookies are text files placed on your computer by a website when you use it to collect standard internet log information and information about the behaviour of visitors to that website. For further information on cookies, visit www.aboutcookies.org or www.allaboutcookies.org.

How long will we keep your personal data?

We will only keep your personal data for as long as it is necessary for the purpose with which it was collected, or in order to comply with our legal and contractual obligations.

At the end of that retention period, your data will either be deleted completely or anonymised, for example by aggregation with other data so that it can be used in a non-identifiable way for statistical analysis and business planning.

You have the right to request a copy of the information that we hold about you. We may make a small charge for this service.
